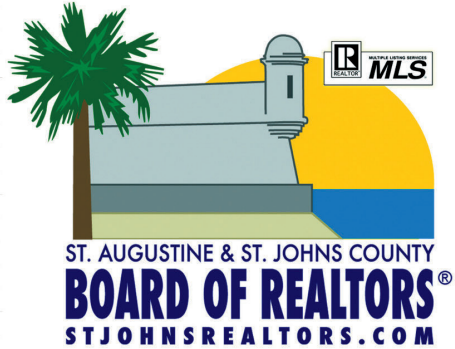

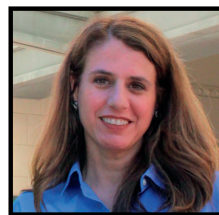

Enhance Your Workforce with Apprenticeships

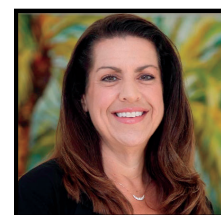
There are a lot of reasons apprenticeships are a better option for employers over internships.

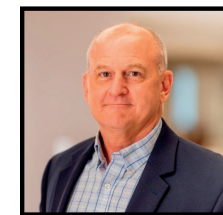

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Flagler Health+ explored options from some of the most respected health care organizations in the country, with a specific focus on:

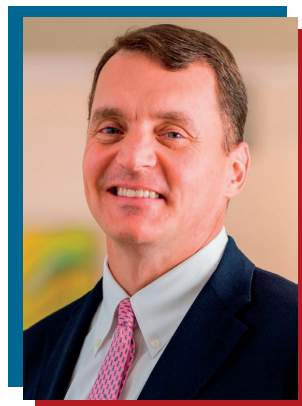
- Continued enhancement of quality and patient satisfaction through the sharing of best practices

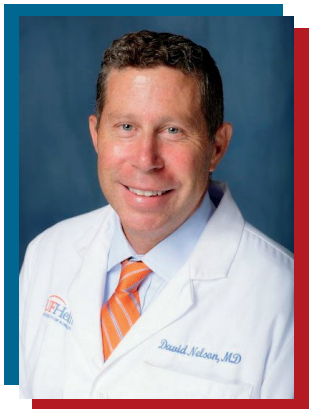

Mr. DeVooght joined Flagler Health+ five years ago after serving as Senior Vice President of Operations for Coastal Community Health. In that role, he oversaw operations of the regional affiliation and interactions with governmental agencies and coordinated all legal actions. Prior to joining Coastal, Mr. DeVooght was Vice President & General Counsel for Southeast Georgia Health System. In this role, he led the organization's legal, real estate, medical staff services, compliance, risk management, and government relations matters, as well as the cancer centers for the health system. Additionally, he was a partner in the law firm of Gilbert, Harrell, Sumerford & Martin, P.C., where he specialized in health care, corporate, regulatory, and estate planning matters.

He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Georgia and received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Georgia School of Law. Mr. DeVooght also has an MBA with a certification in healthcare management from Brenau University, where he received the Leadership Award.

As President & CEO of Flagler Health+, he is a member of numerous boards in NE Florida, including those of the Flagler Foundation and the First Coast Health Alliance.

Mr. DeVooght also serves on the boards of the United Way of St. Johns County, the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Board of Advisors, Vizient Southeast, and Community Hospice and Palliative Care. He volunteers his time at the St. Augustine Rotary Club and serves on the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Public Policy Commission and SJC Chamber Economic Development Council.



David R. Nelson, M.D.

David R. Nelson, M.D., was appointed senior vice president for health affairs at the University of Florida and president of UF Health in April 2019. Dr. Nelson oversees operations for all components of UF Health, the university's academic health center, with campuses in Gainesville, Jacksonville and Central Florida. This includes six health science colleges, 10 interdisciplinary research centers and institutes, three hospital systems and more than 100 physician practices.

Plans are underway to create two new hospitals with Jupiter Medical Center in South Florida, which will boost health care access in the region by bringing top doctors and the latest advances in facilities and technology to residents of Palm Beach and Martin counties and the surrounding region. Dr. Nelson is committed to strategically positioning UF Health for smart growth, with a focus on engaging in high-value partnerships that further shared cultures and goals; enhancing operations; supporting faculty, staff and students; and fostering a diverse, inclusive and equitable community.

A key UF Health mission is exploring ways to optimize the speed of translation of research, bringing science to the bedside and to the community to improve patient care for individuals and populations — with a vision of transforming lives in the pursuit of world-class patient outcomes while strengthening integration, energizing collaboration and enhancing impact.

Under Dr. Nelson's leadership, UF Scripps Biomedical Research joined the UF and UF Health family in April 2022. A professor of medicine and an expert in liver disease, Dr. Nelson's record of academic achievement includes more than \$100 million in research funding, more than 200 publications and multiple leadership roles in his area of expertise.

Flagler Health+, UF Health Reach Agreement



ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. (May 16, 2023) Flagler Health+ and the University of Florida's academic health center, UF Health, have reached a definitive agreement designed to bring innovative, high-quality, leading-edge care to the region. The organizations

anticipate formally closing on the deal this summer and will then begin integrating Flagler Health+ into UF Health later this year.

In February, the Flagler Health+ Board of Trustees and leadership team selected UF Health as the like-minded organization it wanted to move forward with to enhance local health care services and expand access to care in the community.

"UF Health is uniquely positioned to bring much-needed top-flight service to Northeast Florida and to ensure that all of the region's residents have access to the very best health care available," said UF President Ben Sasse. "Florida's population growth is remarkable, and Flagler and St. Johns are among the state's 10 fastest-growing counties. This agreement builds on Flagler's long tradition of caring for the community and positions UF to offer the latest breakthroughs in pursuit of ensuring Floridians can enjoy the quality of life they deserve."

David R. Nelson, M.D., senior vice president for health affairs at UF and president of UF Health, said this is an exciting time for UF Health.

"Throughout our discussions, a constant has been the desire to deliver outstanding health care to the people in the area," Nelson said. "UF Health will bring its unique capabilities as an academic health system, with technologically advanced care focused on world-class outcomes, research opportunities including clinical trials, and training programs for the next generation of care providers, to build upon the Flagler Health+ legacy of meeting the health care needs of the residents of Flagler, St. Johns, Putnam, Clay and Duval counties."

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
